I write you from Montrose County as the President of C.A.M. Electric Inc. to express our support for the Colorado Outdoor Recreation and Economy (CORE) Act. This piece of legislation is over a decade in the making and has widespread support across Colorado. From the mineral withdrawals in critical big game habitat, to the establishment of the Curecanti National Recreation Area boundary managed by the National Park Service, to the Wilderness designations across high peaks, and to the memorial at Camp Hale, this legislation is as diverse in its protections as it is in its supporters.

Our business and community, like so many across Colorado, rely on protected public lands to support our economy and foster our way of life. Here at C.A.M.
